Some interesting Facts about Elandskloof

Elandskloof is the oldest trout farm in Mpumalanga situated close to Dullstroom, 280km from Johannesburg.

It started around the 1960's, when Dolf Combrink took an interest in fly fishing and the breeding of trout. He built the first dam in the area in 1952, which he stocked with trout he got from Lydenburg State Hatchery. It was a small dam but the start to a well known Trout Farm.

Friends came from near and far to fish and after the fishing attraction between the friends Dolf saw the mess they were making and decided to charge them 5c for a days fishing. Around 1960 Dolf accommodated the first overnight guests in the original farm house, which is still in the resort area available to guests. In 1962 Dolf built the biggest private dam in the Transvaal, 8 hectares, and thus 3 more dams followed.

In 1966 Dolf and his son Kobus built a hatchery to breed their own trout, and had around 400 females and 100 males in the hatchery dams. During these years the adult hatchery had around 1 million trout at any time. The farm was selling fresh as well as smoked trout to the public and stocked the dams on the farm, as well as those of other trout & leisure farms. The resort was only a small part of the farming operation those days and was only marketed to Family and their Close friends.

The resort is now a much bigger part of the farm operation and the hatchery trout is only used to stock the dams on the farm due to the increased demand by the public for a place to relax with plenty of space that can accommodate families and enough recreational activities for everyone.

Not only is Elandskloof well known for the fishing but many may not know that Elandskloof has made a name for itself in history. Elandskloof played an important role in the Anglo Boer war where our country made an everlasting impression on the English. The battle field where the boere lay waiting patiently for the enemies to approach is still visible on the farm with the original boundary walls still standing.

Much of the history of the final phase of the second Anglo Boer war lies in mystery.

The interest in the action at Vlakfontein (Elandskloof) lies partly in the Commander of the British column, Colonel G E Benson, partly in the award of a Victorian Cross there and partly in the importance of the ground nearby, Mareskop, which overlooked from the north the town of Machadodorp on the railway line and roads from Johannesburg to Delagoa Bay.

There is much dispute about the role that Vlakfontein played during the war, but it has been recorded that not only was Vlakfontein farm a healthy area for both man and beast, providing grazing, shelter and water.

Vlakfontein was also very difficult to be approach without being observed. Mareskop was provided an ideal site for the heliograph. Thus it must be fair to conclude that the Vlakfontein site was the key to Boer communications for a large part of the eastern Transvaal.

Go on a quad bike route and see how our history lay itself out and become one with nature and the beauty. Paint a picture for yourself how the Anglo Boer war scene was and imagine how the battle was constructed, sit and see why the boere fought to there last breath for there country.

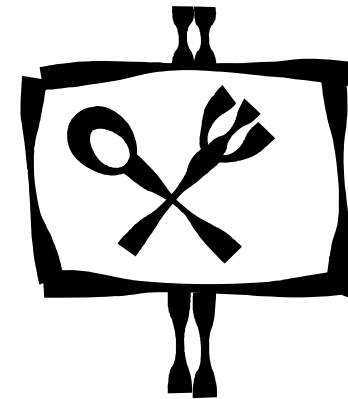

Length: 55 cm
Gestation period: 3 weeks
Potential longevity: 12 – 13 years
Number of young: 2 – 3 young

It inhabits burrows and is commonly found in groups of 6 or more. Feeds mainly on insects.

Water Mongoose (Atilax paludinosus)

Length: 60cm
Number of young: 2 at a time

Frequents reeds and other vegetation margining rivers and dams. Usually dark brown in colour. Takes readily to water when pursued. Feeds on fish, frogs, crabs, insects, snakes and birds, and is partial to birds' eggs.

Clawless Otter (Aonyx capensis)

Mass: 10 kg

Potential longevity: 16 years
Gestation period: 9 weeks
Number of young: 2 – 5 young

Present in the perennial streams and pools of the farm. Feeds mainly on crabs, fish, frogs, birds and birds' eggs.

We have two different kinds of Otter's here. The one is much bigger and lighter than the other one.

Mountain Zebra (Equus zebra)

Found in the mountain ranges of the south-eastern Cape, it has been on the farm for the last 35 years. Differs from the Burchell's Zebra in that a definite dewlap is present. There are also no shadow stripes and the stripes do not meet on the underside of the body. The stripes on the legs extend clearly down to the hooves and encircle the legs.

Side- striped Jackal (Canis adustus)

A timid and rate type. Feeds on small mammals, ground-roosting birds, eggs and insects. Characterised by a definite white stripe on each flank and the white tip of the tail.

Aardwolf (Proteles cristatus)

Shoulder height: 40 – 50 cm
Total body mass: 9 – 12 kg

Forelegs are much longer than the hind legs. The 15 – 20 cm long mane, stretches along the neck and back, extending to the tail base.

The tail is very bushy with a black tip.

They can consume up to 300 000 termites. In one night. Main food source are trinervitermes and hodotermes termites. Mainly nocturnal, but can show crepuscular activity during the winter months.

Small-spotted Genet (Genetta genetta)

Height: 20cm
Mass: 2 kg
Length: 95cm
Potential Longevity: 12 – 13 years
Number of young: 3

Differs from the rusty-spotted genet in the colour of the spots only. Preys on small mammals and birds, and is particularly fond of chicks which it robs from the nests. Also catches frogs ant the water's edge.

Civet (Viverra civetta)

A nocturnal animal. The head is small with short ears. The basic colour is yellowish grey with black spots and the legs are black. The tail is black with white rings. Feeds on insects, reptiles and small mammals. Partial to carrion and wild fruit.

Hindquarters slightly higher than shoulders; general reddish-fawn colouration; short tail' pointed ears with tuft of black hair at tip and black at back sprinkled with white hairs.
Mainly nocturnal, but partly diurnal if undisturbed. They are extremely good jumpers and climbers and there have been recorded jumping heights of up to 4 m in the air.

Serval (Felis serval)

Height:	50 cm
Length:	130 cm
Number of young:	3

A long-legged cat with a small head and large ears, handsomely marked with dark spots and a tawny background. On the back the spots become elongated to form stripes. The tail is short. It feeds chiefly on small mammals and birds but also eats insects, especially beetles.

Black-backed Jackal (Canis mesomelas)

Dog-like appearance; dark, white-flecked, 'saddle' on back; black tail; fairly large, pointed, reddish-backed ears.
Mainly nocturnal when in conflict with man, but in protected reserves is frequently seen during day. When resting, it may lie up in a burrow dug by other species, or under a bush or other vegetation. Its call is characteristic and has been described as a screaming yell, finished off with 3 or 4 short yaps. It takes an extremely wide range of food items, from young antelope, rodents, hares, birds, reptiles and insects to wild fruits and berries.

Antbear (Orycteropus afer)

Total Length:	1.4 – 1.8 m

Unmistakable; large size; elongated pig-like snout; tubular ears; generally heavy build; predominantly arched backed.
The Aardvark favours sandy and clay soils in open woodlands, scrubland and grassland savanna. It is rarely seen during the day, with most activity taking place during night (nocturnal). They may walk several kilometres while foraging. Main food source are termites and ants.

Bush Pig (Potamochoerus porcus)

Total Shoulder height:	55 – 88 cm
Total body weight:	45 – 115kg
Gestation:	170 days
Number of young:	average 3 – 4 piglets

Pig-like appearance; well-haired body; tufts of hair on ear tips; long head; tail held down when running. Facial hair much lighter in colour than rest of body. Bushpigs are mainly nocturnal, but when in undisturbed areas they have shown diurnal behaviour. When bushpigs are wounded or cornered, they can be extremely dangerous and violent.

Porcupine (Hystrix africaeaustralis)
